# Approved Document B Update

The Ministry Housing, Communities,

and Local Government (MHCLG) has updated Approved



Ministry of Housing, Communities & Local Government

Document B

(Fire safety) Volume 1 (Dwellings) and Volume 2 (Buildings other than dwellings) of the Building regulations to incorporate future amendments.

The consolidated version sees the 2019 edition, incorporating the 2020 and 2022 amendments, now collated with the forthcoming 2025, 2026 and 2029 amendments. Full details are available here.

#### **Domestic Furniture**

The Office of Product Safety and Standards has provided a progress update from the Minister for Employment

Employment Rights, Competition and Markets on the



Government's

review of the fire safety of domestic upholstered furniture.

The policy paper sets out initial changes it will make to amend the Furniture and Furnishings (Fire) (Safety) Regulations 1988 (the FFRs), and its ongoing plans.

It outlines the Government's proposed new regulatory approach, highlights areas of broad stakeholder consensus and provides an update on outstanding challenges. Details are available here.
